As we step into another month of professional engagement and learning, it is our pleasure to bring you the latest edition of the Siliguri Taxation Bar Association (STBA) Newsletter. This platform continues to serve as a medium to share knowledge, updates, and opportunities that strengthen our fraternity.

Key Developments in Indian Economy

The latest developments in India's economy in recent times include:

- ✓ Trade Negotiations with the U.S.: During Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Washington, trade negotiations with the U.S. resulted in minor concessions, including cuts to tariffs on bourbon whiskey and Harley-Davidson motorcycles. However, uncertainties surrounding U.S. trade policies and tariffs on India remain unresolved, posing risks for the Indian economy.

- ✓ GDP Growth Forecast: India's economy is anticipated to grow by approximately 6.5% in the fiscal year 2024/25, at the lower end of the government's 6.5%-7% projection range due to global uncertainties. The finance ministry's monthly report for November suggests a positive economic outlook for the October to December quarter, driven by strong rural demand and rising urban demand.
- ✓ **Private Sector Output**: Private sector output in India has reached a six-month high in February, indicating a positive trend in economic activity.
- ✓ Interest Rate Cuts: The Reserve Bank of India has signaled the possibility of further interest rate cuts, as indicated in the minutes of the Monetary Policy Committee meeting.
- ✓ **Trade Balance with Japan**: Efforts are underway to balance trade between India and Japan by boosting exports, as the trade deficit with Japan stood at \$12.55 billion in 2023-24.
- ✓ **Infrastructure Investment**: The Indian government continues to focus on infrastructure development, with significant investments in road and rail projects aimed at sustaining economic growth.
